Description

Easy Tiger is a 45ft Cruiser Stern narrowboat built by the much-loved Springer, often described as the “Morris Minor” of the waterways for their enduring popularity and reliable build. This particular boat is offered as a project, but an exciting one: with a sound hull and a solid Thornycroft engine, the essentials are firmly in place. What remains is the opportunity to restore, redecorate, and reimagine her into a warm and welcoming home afloat. She represents fantastic value for anyone ready to roll up their sleeves and breathe new life into a classic narrowboat.

Stepping aboard from the cruiser stern, you enter directly into the galley. It has all the basics in place — a cooker, fridge, and sink, though these have not been tested — along with a generous mix of worktops and cupboards that provide plenty of storage. With a little attention, this space has the potential to become a highly practical and characterful kitchen, perfect for life on the cut.

The bedroom follows, currently fitted with a double bed and foam mattress. It’s a simple but functional space, enhanced by built-in storage that makes the most of the boat’s proportions. With some fresh touches, this cabin could easily become a snug and inviting retreat.

Moving forward, the bathroom offers a shower, wash basin, and Porta Potti cassette toilet. The gulper pump is currently out of action, providing the new owner with an ideal opportunity to modernise this area and fit it out to their own tastes.

At the heart of Easy Tiger lies the saloon, a cosy living area complete with sofa, TV, and a wood-burning stove. It’s a space with enormous potential, ready to be transformed into the perfect spot for relaxing evenings aboard. There is also ample storage here, ensuring that everything you need can be neatly tucked away.

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Practicalities are well covered. The boat is equipped with a water tank of approximately 400 litres, though the pump will need replacement, and a fuel tank of around 200 litres. The Thornycroft engine and gearbox provide proven reliability, ensuring that Easy Tiger is mechanically sound.

In her current state, Easy Tiger is very much a blank canvas. For those willing to invest some time and effort, she offers a rewarding project with strong foundations: a dependable engine, a solid Springer hull, and a versatile layout that flows comfortably from stern to bow. Whether you're seeking a weekend escape, a liveaboard adventure, or simply the joy of restoring a classic narrowboat, Easy Tiger promises plenty of potential at a very appealing price.
