Description

Hermes XI is a charming 42ft trad stern narrowboat, powered by a reliable Isuzu 33hp engine and benefitting from a brand-new bathroom installed in 2023 and strong off-grid credentials including an inverter and solar panels. She offers a cosy and adaptable layout and has potential for light internal refurbishment, reflected in the asking price. This boat is ready to cruise the waterways while allowing her new owners to add their own finishing touches over time.

The bedroom features a full-size double bed, giving a comfortable and restful sleeping area. Additional storage is provided by a chest of drawers, and a wall-mounted TV offers entertainment options. A door leads through to the practical utility space and traditional stern, contributing to the boat's functional flow from bow to stern.

The bathroom was fully refitted in 2023 and includes a brand-new ceramic Thetford cassette toilet, a ceramic sink with storage vanity unit below, and a full-size shower enclosure with two glazed doors. While the installation is new, some cosmetic finishing remains to be completed, offering the new owner the chance to add their preferred style.

The galley is fitted with a stainless-steel sink with a mixer tap, along with a LEC fridge featuring a freezer box and a two-burner gas hob. There are practical worktops, cupboards, and drawers that provide ample storage for extended trips on the water. This space is well laid out for onboard cooking and food preparation.

The welcoming lounge includes a solid fuel stove, ensuring warmth and comfort throughout the cooler months. A three-seater sofa extends into a bed to provide extra sleeping space, while a TV and generous built-in storage enhance relaxation and convenience. Two glazed doors open out onto a well-sized well deck, creating a seamless connection to the outside.

Hermes XI includes a stainless-steel 568 litre water tank and a 189 litre fuel tank, plus heating from the solid fuel stove and hot water supplied by the engine, calorifier, and immersion. She benefits from a new base plate installed in 2021, four batteries including three domestics, and a galvanic isolator for hull protection. Please note that this boat currently holds a Declaration of Conformity as a partially completed traditional narrowboat, and as such does not hold an RCD.
