From the stern, Hewis features a well-designed utility area with a Morse controller, 12v and 240v control panel, excellent access to the engine, and ample storage — a practical and organised space that sets the tone for life aboard. The reliable Beta Marine 35hp engine paired with a PRM 150 gearbox provides confident handling and smooth cruising across the network. Moving forward, the bedroom offers a calm and comfortable retreat, featuring a full-size double bed with generous storage drawers beneath, over-bed reading lights, and fitted cupboards. A full-height wardrobe alongside a shelf and drawer unit (mini dresser) ensures there's no shortage of storage, making longer stays aboard both easy and enjoyable. The bathroom is smartly finished and well proportioned, with a ceramic wash basin and vanity unit, a full-size shower with glazed door, cassette toilet, and plenty of built-in storage — practical without compromising on comfort. The galley is a standout feature, thoughtfully equipped for real cooking aboard. Corian/granite worktops provide both durability and style, complemented by a dual bowl stainless steel sink with mixer tap. Appliances include a Swan retro fridge,

Vanette GG7000 oven and grill, and a Thetford two-burner gas hob, all surrounded by ample cupboards and drawers to keep everything neatly stowed. At the bow, the welcoming saloon creates a warm and sociable living space. A genuine three-seater Futon sofa (new in 2022) easily converts into an additional double berth, allowing Hewis to comfortably sleep up to four. A solid fuel stove provides cosy warmth during cooler months, while a media unit and plentiful shelving offer practical storage and display space. Recent upgrades include a new Webasto boiler fitted in 2025, further enhancing onboard comfort and reliability. With approximately 500 litres of water capacity and a fuel tank of around 181 litres, Hewis is well set up for extended cruising or life afloat.
