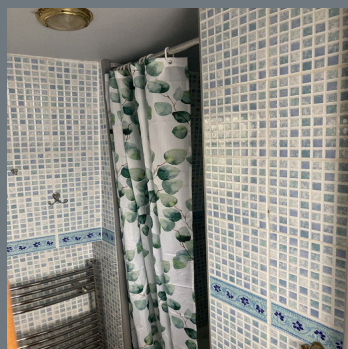

At the stern, the bedroom is cleverly designed with a bed that extends across the boat to form a comfortable double. Ample storage is provided by two wardrobes, two sets of drawers, shelving, and under-bed compartments, ensuring there is plenty of room for personal belongings.

Moving forward, the bathroom is smartly fitted with a shower, sink, compost toilet, extractor fan, and heated towel rail. Practical yet
